

Medicare Advantage: Continuous glucose monitors available with a \$0 copay in 2026

Effective Jan. 1, 2026, continuous glucose monitor (CGM) access is expanding to include a \$0 copay when using in-network pharmacies.

To improve ease of access for individual Humana Medicare Advantage prescription drug (MAPD) plan members, CGM supplies (transmitters, receivers/readers and sensors) will be made available through pharmacies at the point of sale, including CenterWell Pharmacy®.

The \$0 copay will be available at in-network pharmacies for the following products (starting Jan. 1, 2026):

- Dexcom G6 receiver, transmitter and sensor
- Dexcom G7 receiver and sensor
- FreeStyle Libre 2 reader and sensor
- FreeStyle Libre 3 reader and sensor
- FreeStyle Libre 14-day reader and sensor

Please note:

- Members need to satisfy Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) criteria to purchase CGM supplies through the pharmacy at the point of sale or through a national durable medical equipment (DME) vendor.
- The member must be enrolled in an individual MAPD plan and use an in-network pharmacy to qualify for the \$0 copay.
- A prior authorization may be required if a member's use of CGM supplies is not consistent with CMS criteria.
- CGMs are \$0 at an in-network pharmacy and excluded from the deductible for nearly all Individual MA plans. The exception is Institutional SNPs and the iCare D-SNP plan, which have 20% coinsurance.
