



When are the exams?

EPSDT exams and screenings begin at birth and go through age 21 for active Humana Healthy Horizons members. By the time they're 2 and a half, children should have 12 checkups: birth (at the hospital), three to five days after birth, and at 1, 2, 4, 6, 9, 12, 15, 18, 24, and 30 months. Members in Kentucky between the ages of 3 and 20 get one checkup each year.



Are there other programs for families?

Yes! As part of the EPSDT program, members from birth to age 21 can get care management services. This is for those who have special healthcare needs or who ask for help.

Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic and Treatment (EPSDT) program


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What EPSDT means for your child

- **E Early:** making sure your child gets the care they need, when they need it
- P Periodic: setting up regular visits at recommended ages
- S Screening: checking for health problems to catch them early
- D Diagnostic: testing to follow up when a risk or problem is found
- T Treatment: things you can do to help your child lower their risks



Your child's pediatrician is their primary care provider (PCP). Their pediatrician will monitor your child's health and development. Screenings and tests like the ones below can help your child's doctor spot health issues early. Early detection makes it easier to get connected to the right treatment.

- Autism screening, which can detect early signs of autism and allow for referrals
- Complete exam (unclothed with parent/guardian approval)
- Dental screening
- Depression screening (when age-appropriate)
- Developmental screening, which checks for age-appropriate mental and physical growth
- Hearing assessment
- Immunization (vaccine)
 assessment, to make sure your
 child stays on the recommended
 vaccine schedule

- Lead screening
- · Medical history
- Other services/screenings as needed

EPSDT Special Services cover medically necessary care for health issues found during an EPSDT well-care visit.



Who is covered?

Humana Healthy Horizons® in Kentucky members are covered from birth through the month of their 21st birthday.



What is covered?

About our EPSDT program

Your child's well-care and preventive checkups are important for early detection of potential health issues. These visits are also known as our Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic and Treatment (EPSDT) program. Humana Healthy Horizons is here to help your child achieve their best health, from birth to age 21.

The EPSDT program provides health exams and screenings through well-care, or preventive, visits (checkups). These checkups are offered to members from birth through the month they turn 21.
