

# Medication-assisted Treatment Prescriber Mentoring Program

#### What is medication-assisted treatment?

Medication-assisted treatment (MAT) is an evidence-based approach that combines behavioral therapy and medications to treat individuals with substance use disorders.

MAT can reestablish normal brain function, reduce substance cravings, and prevent relapse.

#### What are the benefits of MAT?

- Decreases opioid-related deaths
- Decreases illicit opioid use
- Increases social functioning and retention in treatment
- Decreases criminal activity
- Improves maternal and fetal outcomes for pregnant or breastfeeding women
- Decreases transmission of infectious diseases, such as human immunodeficiency virus and hepatitis C
- Reduces neonatal opioid withdrawal syndrome, a subset of neonatal abstinence syndrome

#### How do I learn more?

The Florida Alcohol and Drug Abuse Association (FADAA) offers an extensive portfolio of activities that include a variety of MAT training and technical assistance events. FADAA is considered a leading voice in substance use policy and related practice improvement by national, state and local policymakers, treatment providers and the recovery community.

#### What is the peer prescriber mentoring program?

FADAA hosts a team of nine prescriber mentors who support the expansion of MAT throughout the state of Florida. The team of peer prescribers specialize in a variety of areas including:

- Addiction medicine
- Addiction psychiatry
- Emergency medicine
- Psychiatry
- Obstetrics/gynecology

Peer prescribers are responsible for providing training, support and consultation to other providers who are interested in prescribing MAT.

Peer prescriber support

- Case consultation
- Technical assistance
- Staff training

## How can I take the training?

Peer prescribers are located throughout the state of Florida and are available to provide training in-person or virtually. Training also is available via their website and can be viewed at the attendee's leisure. Continuing medical education credits are available for attendees who take the training.
