It's the Standard of Care!

- The USPSTF recommends primary care clinicians apply fluoride varnish to the teeth of all infants and children (first primary tooth through age 5) at least every 6 months.
- Providers gain up to 0.36 Work RVU.

5% Sodium Fluoride Varnish

- · Safe, inexpensive and effective.
- · High efficacy for prevention of dental caries in children under 6 years of age.
- · Not associated with treatment-related adverse events in young children.
- · Quickly and easily applied.
- · Prevents new caries and progression of early caries.

Application of Fluoride Varnish

- 1. Evaluate teeth at every well-child screening.
- 2. Use gauze to blot the teeth dry.
- 3. Apply varnish to back teeth first (if present), and front teeth last, covering all surfaces of all teeth.

4. Saliva contamination after application is expected and varnish sets on contact with saliva.

Follow-up instructions

- · No brushing until the next morning.
- · Children can eat and drink immediately after application.
- · Avoid sticky, hot, and very hard foods until next day.

Anticipatory Guidance

- · Recommend regular dental visits refer to Dental Home.
- Recommend brushing with fluoride toothpaste twice a day. No more than the size of a grain of rice or a smear for children under age 3. Only a pea-sized amount for children 3 years and older.
- · Only water in sippy cups.

- · Drink tap water.
- · No juice under 1 year of age.
- · No soda consumption.
