Breast pumps

Hospital grade and nonhospital grade breast pumps are a covered benefit for new mothers. Both require submission of an OB-GYN referral to one of the contracted vendors.

Request authorization or referral from Humana Healthy Horizons using either of the following options:

- Call 800-523-0023 and state that the reason for the call is to request authorization or referral for a pregnant Medicaid member.

Pregnancy services

- Nuchal translucency measurement
 - One ultrasound for nuchal translucency measurement per pregnancy, for members with a high-risk pregnancy
- Ultrasounds
 - Up to three obstetrical ultrasounds per pregnancy
 - Up to three transvaginal obstetrical ultrasounds for members with a high-risk pregnancy

Genetic testing coverage

Circumcision

Circumcisions are covered up to 28 days of age at no cost to the member/parent and no need for medical necessity. Beyond 28 days, coverage will be based on medical necessity.

Family planning

No prior authorization is required for family planning, including long-acting reversible contraception (LARC). For more information, see our LARC Coverage with Inpatient Services Billing Guide.

Family planning waiver

Women who had Medicaid during pregnancy do not have to apply. They are automatically enrolled for the first year. All women must reapply for the second year of services.

Humana will allow the following services for pregnant managed medical assistance (MMA) members without prior authorization:

Birth coaching during delivery

- · Postpartum care
- Prenatal services

The program is for OB-GYN providers who are not participating in the MMA Provider Incentive Program (MPIP) and deliver 20 or more babies with Humana Healthy Horizons per year. Pregnant members who enroll in and complete the HumanaBeginnings prenatal or postpartum program can earn the following per pregnancy:

- \$20 reward for pregnancy
- \$15 reward for visiting their OB-GYN for a prenatal visit during their first trimester or within 42 days of enrolling with the plan
- \$15 reward for visiting their OB-GYN for a postpartum visit within 7–84 days after delivery (must be enrolled in the HumanaBeginnings postpartum program)
- Total eligible reward of \$50

To earn rewards, members must:

- Be 13 years of age or older
- Download the Go365 for Humana Healthy Horizons® app on a mobile device
- Create an account to access and engage in the program
- Have their Medicaid ID available

Substance use disorder

The Substance Use Program is a six-month program that offers Humana Healthy Horizons members an incentive to become and remain drug- and/or alcohol-free. Participants can earn:

- **\$15 reward** for enrolling and completing three sessions within three months of the first session
- \$15 reward for completing three additional sessions (six sessions total) within six months of enrolling
- **\$20 reward** for active participation in an outpatient program for 28–30 days

To earn rewards, members must:

- Be 18 years of age or older
- Work with the substance use counselor and complete a minimum of six coaching sessions and outpatient treatment with the intent of becoming and remaining drug- and/or alcohol-free.

Medication-assisted treatment

What is medication-assisted treatment?

Medication-assisted treatment (MAT) is an evidence-based approach that combines behavioral therapy and medications to treat individuals with substance use disorders.

MAT can reestablish normal brain function, reduce substance cravings and prevent relapse. Among the various benefits, treatment with MAT can lead to improved maternal and fetal outcomes for pregnant or breastfeeding people;, a decrease in neonatal opioid withdrawal syndrome, a subset of neonatal abstinence syndrome; and a decrease in illicit opioid use.

How do I learn more?

The Florida Alcohol and Drug Abuse Association (FADAA) offers an extensive portfolio of activities that includes a variety of MAT training and technical assistance events. FADAA is considered a leading voice in substance use policy and related practice improvement by national, state and local policymakers. FADAA offers a variety of programs and resources, including a peer prescriber mentoring program, which supports the expansion of MAT throughout the state. Peer prescribers are responsible for providing training, support and consultation to other providers who are interested in prescribing MAT.
