

# Caring for your baby with Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome

How to spot signs they need help

Having a baby with Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (NAS) brings challenges but there are ways to comfort and support your new baby. This guide will help you to care for your baby in the first few days and weeks of life.

Staying alert is very important. Take control of your child's future by watching for signs of NAS. NAS occurs when a baby withdraws from an addictive substance that they were exposed to during pregnancy.<sup>1</sup>

Almost any substance in your blood can pass to your baby. That includes medicine, alcohol, nicotine, drugs and herbal supplements. When a baby is born, that supply through your bloodstream stops suddenly. They may show symptoms of withdrawal within a few hours to a few days after birth.<sup>2,3</sup>

It's hard to know which babies will have NAS. They may need medicine or need to spend extra time at the hospital in a special care unit.

### Symptoms may include, but are not limited to: 2

- · Crying a lot
- Trembling or shaking
- · Throwing up, diarrhea, or both
- · Fever and sweating

- Stuffy nose
- Sneezing or yawning a lot
- · Having a hard time feeding and sucking
- · Being sensitive to light, sounds and touch

### What you can do for your baby

Take your child to a quiet and calm room away from others. Also be sure to keep the lights low, turn off the TV, silence your phone and speak in a low voice. Breastfeeding, skin-to-skin holding, and gentle rocking and touching can also be soothing.<sup>2</sup>

### Keep their health on schedule with wellness checkups

Children born with NAS should be followed closely and monitored by their doctor.<sup>3</sup> Early care is important for their long-term health.
